

Out town: Super Bowl support

The Holy Cross Anglican Chapel of the Words of Blessing Ministry supports neither the Giants nor the Patriots, but will use the day of the Super Bowl, Sunday, Feb. 3, to solicit support for food pantries in the area.

Those attending services on that day are asked to bring cans of soup as a special offering. This effort is called Soup-Er Bowl Sunday.

Those who want to participate in the food collection can drop off soup from 9 a.m. to noon at the chapel. The chapel is at 500 Park Ave., Unit 102, in Lake Villa. It is the Words of Blessing Ministry Headquarters.

Sunday services, following the traditional Episcopal liturgy, begin at 9:30 a.m., including Soup-Er Bowl Sunday. Everyone is invited to join with members of the Words of Blessing Ministry on Feb. 3 and every Sunday.
